- 1 The applicant seeks special leave to appeal from the whole of the judgment of the Court of Appeal of the Supreme Court of Victoria (Walker JA) which refused the applicant's application for leave to appeal from the decision of the Supreme Court of Victoria (Richards J) made on 12 July 2024 which had refused to direct the first respondent to seal a document the applicant had sought to file in the Criminal Division of the Supreme Court headed "Application of Robert Thorpe" addressed to Charles Arthur Philip George Windsor and Jacinta Allan seeking, among other things, directions from the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court that a special proceeding be commenced in the Court's criminal jurisdiction in a matter of genocide charges as well as the assembly of a special court to be called the "Aboriginal Genocide Court".
- 2 The application does not raise any question of general principle and there is no reason to doubt the correctness of the decision of the Court of Appeal to warrant a grant of special leave to appeal.
- 3 Special leave to appeal is refused.
